Lake County Mental Health (LCMH) is announcing the 30-day comment period from February 17 – March 19, 2010 for the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) FY 2010/11 Annual Update to the Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan, the Community Services and Supports (CSS) and Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) FY 2009/10 Prudent Reserve Funding Request, and the FY 2008/09 and 2009/10 PEI Training, Technical Assistance and Capacity Building Funds Request.

The public hearing will be held at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 25, 2010 in Conference Room B at the Courthouse located at 255 N. Forbes Street in Lakeport.

MHSA provides an array of services to those persons of all ages who suffer from, or are at risk of, severe mental illness. These services include full service partnerships with individual consumers in need of intensive, “whatever it takes” services to avoid hospitalization, incarceration or homelessness due to mental illness. MHSA provides general services such as the adult and transitional age drop-in centers as well as mental health services for those involved with the jail or juvenile justice systems. Others benefit from outreach and engagement to those populations deemed underserved or not served by traditional mental health services.
